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Recommendations/Plan:

- Please return to the clinic in 3 day(s) if not better. Call or return to this clinic sooner if your condition worsens or if you have any concerns.
- Discussion and conclusion: Examined patient and discussed current symptoms. On physical exam he does have an acute otitis media in the right ear with postnasal drip noted in the posterior pharynx. Will place him on a course of amoxicillin for otitis media, Flonase and Zyrtec-D for sinus congestion/postnasal drip. Increase fluids. Follow-up with primary care provider symptoms persist. ER for emergent needs.
- You must understand that you have received an urgent care treatment only and that you may be released before all your medical problems are known or treated. You, the patient, will arrange for follow-up care as instructed.

Follow-up with your PCP or specialty clinic as directed in the next 7 to 10 days if not improved or as needed. You can call to schedule an appointment with the appropriate provider.

If your condition worsens we recommend that you receive another evaluation at the emergency room immediately or contact your primary medical clinic after-hours call service to discuss your concerns.

Please return here or go to the emergency department for any concerns or worsening of condition.

If you are prescribed a narcotic or controlled medication, do not drive or operate heavy equipment or machinery while taking these medications.

Advanced imaging and immediate labs are not available, therefore, the prognosis of this acute illness is uncertain.
